Thank you for your interest in publishing via the Journal of Living Labs. The information below serves the purpose of guiding you through the preparation of your manuscript.

1 Aims and Scope

Structured abstract with 5 sections. Introduction; Aims/ Objectives; Methods; Results (or Data

analysis plan- 2.3); Conclusion

Keywords: 5-10

2.2 Original articles; Research and Evaluation articles

Word limit: 3000-6000

o This excludes abstract; tables; figures; illustrations; references and appendices

Text body:

<u>Introduction:</u> Provides a background and a rationale to the study.

Aims/ Objectives/ Hypotheses: The objectives of the study.

<u>Methods:</u> An outline of the procedures utilised that represents the methodological steps taken to complete the study.

<u>Results:</u> Sufficient description of results via the use of illustrations, if relevant.

<u>Discussion:</u> Brief summary of results (no equations or significance levels); interpretation of findings; strengths; limitations; future directions; conclusion.

2.3 Study Protocols

Word limit: 6000 Maximum

o This excludes abstract; tables; figures; illustrations; references and appendices

Text body:

<u>Introduction:</u> Provides a background and a rationale to the study.

Aims/ Objectives/ Hypotheses: The objectives of the study.

<u>Methods:</u> An outline of the procedures utilised that represents future methodological steps to be taken to complete the study.

<u>Data analysis plan (if any):</u> Sufficient description of the upcoming data analysis.

<u>Discussion:</u> Expected findings and the potential implications of such findings.

2.4 Reviews

Word limit: 3000-9000

o This excludes abstract; tables; figures; illustrations; references and appendices

Text body:

<u>Introduction:</u> Provides a background and a rationale to the study.

<u>Aims/ Objectives:</u> The objectives of the study.

<u>Methods:</u> An outline of the procedures utilised that represents the methodological steps taken to complete the study.

<u>Results:</u> Sufficient description of results via the use of illustrations, if relevant.

<u>Discussion:</u> Interpretation of findings; limitations; future directions; conclusion.

2.5 Letters

Word limit: 500 Maximum

o This excludes tables; figures; illustrations; references and appendices

2.6 Commentaries; Perspectives; Opinion Pieces

Word limit: 1500 Max.

- o This excludes references (minimum of 4)
- o This includes tables; figures; illustrations

3 Format and style of the manuscript

Abstract; keywords; text body; references; tables; figures; illustrations; appendices should comply with the current APA guidelines: https://apastyle.apa.org/

The text body should present 1-inch margins and double line spacing. Any, common 12-point fonts are acceptable, as long as use is consistent throughout the manuscript.

Tables; figures and illustrations should be included after the references and before the appendices.

4.2 Authors contributions

Briefly describe the contribution of each author to the manuscript.

4.3 Acknowledgements

Anyone who contributed to the study but does not meet the criteria for authorship as per the permission of the author(s).

4.4 Conflict of interest statement

The nature of conflicts due to any interests, whether personal or financial, that may influence the authors` objectivity.

5 Copyright agreement

Ensure that you have read and understand the copyright agreement. You will need to agree this upon submission.
