PRISM Image Guidelines

As PRISM is an online journal digital content must be optimised for on-screen viewing.

Photographs and other images (such as digital photographs, scanned images, screen grabs and most web images) fall into this category.

- Image size: longest edge between 1500-2500 pixels (Please make sure images are scaled proportionately, without squashing or distortion).
- File format: JPEG (.jpg) or PNG (.png) and be of a high quality.
- Colour space and depth: RGB colour, 8 bits per channel.

Vector graphics and illustrations, charts and tables (including those created in Adobe Illustrator) can be scaled to any size with no loss of quality.

- File format: scalable vector graphic (.svg)
- colour space: RGB colour (SVG does not currently support embedded fonts. We recommend using 'create outlines' or typing the heading to ensure your font choice is preserved).

Video Animation and Other Moving Imagery

- if you want readers to be able to view your videos you are required to use a video hosting service such as Vimeo or YouTube
- We recommend using Vimeo (<u>http://vimeo.com</u>) which have higher quality video, no distracting advertising and generally better quality content than you tube
- You can provide a link to your video in your paper. This can be formatted in such a way that the reader is taken directly to your video.
- We can also embed your videos on the PRISM blog along with a link to your paper.
