## 2  Toxteth riots also known as L8 riots, erupted on the night of July 5th and lasted over nine days. There were 468 police officers injured, 500 people got arrested and more than 100 vehicles were seton fire in the rioting. The disturbance was eventually terminated by the police using CS gas to disperse crowds - this marked the first time CS gas was used on British mainland. There are a variety of explanations on the cause of the riots in the studies: aggressive policing, racial tension, criminal opportunism and political neglect resulting in the economic decline and the increasing unemployment (Marren, 2016). equally.
